GAFutures

(Provides a skills assessment, school and occupational information, and job outlook for Georgia)

1. Go to <http://www.gafutures.org>
2. Click on **Create An Account** (If you have a current GACollege411 profile, you can use those account credentials to sign in)
3. Click on **Career Exploration**
4. Click on **Interest Profiler**
5. Complete the assessment
6. Print out your results
7. You may also view information about occupations and schools in this program.
